

GUIDELINES FOR AUTHORS

- (1) The article should be submitted in English in the form of two computer printouts and an electronic document in *.doc (Microsoft Word) format. The pages should be numbered. Basic settings: 12-point Times New Roman font, 1.5 spacing, and standard margins (2.5 cm each).
- (2) The article (text, figures, tables, references, summary) should have from 8 to 12 pages.
- (3) The title page should include: the title of the article, the author's name and surname, affiliation, address, and e-mail.
- (4) In the body of the text, when referring to literature, the author's name and year of publication should be given, e.g. "... (Smith, 2005)", "in Smith (2005)", etc.; if there is a quotation, also the page number (Smith, 2005, p. 4). If reference is made to two or more works by the same author published in the same years, they should be distinguished by a letter, e.g. Smith (2005a, b). If there are two authors, the reference should be: (Smith and Brown, 2003); if more, (Smith et al., 2007). The "et al." should be replaced with all the authors' names in the list of references.
- (5) The literature, restricted to the references quoted, should be prepared in alphabetic order, without abbreviations, according to the following pattern:
 - **monographs:**
Aglietta M., 1979, A theory of capitalist regulation: The US experience, New Left Books, London.
 - **articles in journals:**
Healey P., 1992, Planning through debate. The communicative turn to planning theory, Town Planning Review, 63, 2, pp. 143-162.
 - **chapters in collective publications:**
Martin R., 2000, Institutional approaches in economic geography, (in:) Sheppard E., Barnes T.J. (eds), A companion to economic geography, Blackwell, Oxford, pp. 77-94.
- (6) The illustrative material should be submitted in a digital version (e.g. on a CD) as a raster graphics file (only the TIFF, JPG or GIF formats) at a minimum resolution of 300 dpi, or a vector graphics file (only the CDR, WMF, EMF or AI formats), in black and white.
- (7) Each figure and table should have a title, be numbered consecutively, and provide the source of data.
- (8) There should also be a summary of not more than half a page (up to 300 words) printed on a separate sheet of paper.

GUIDELINES FOR AUTHORS OF POSTERS

- (1) A poster should be submitted in the form of a computer printout in A1 format. It should have the heading:

- (2) followed by the poster title as well as the author's name and surname, affiliation, address, and e-mail.
